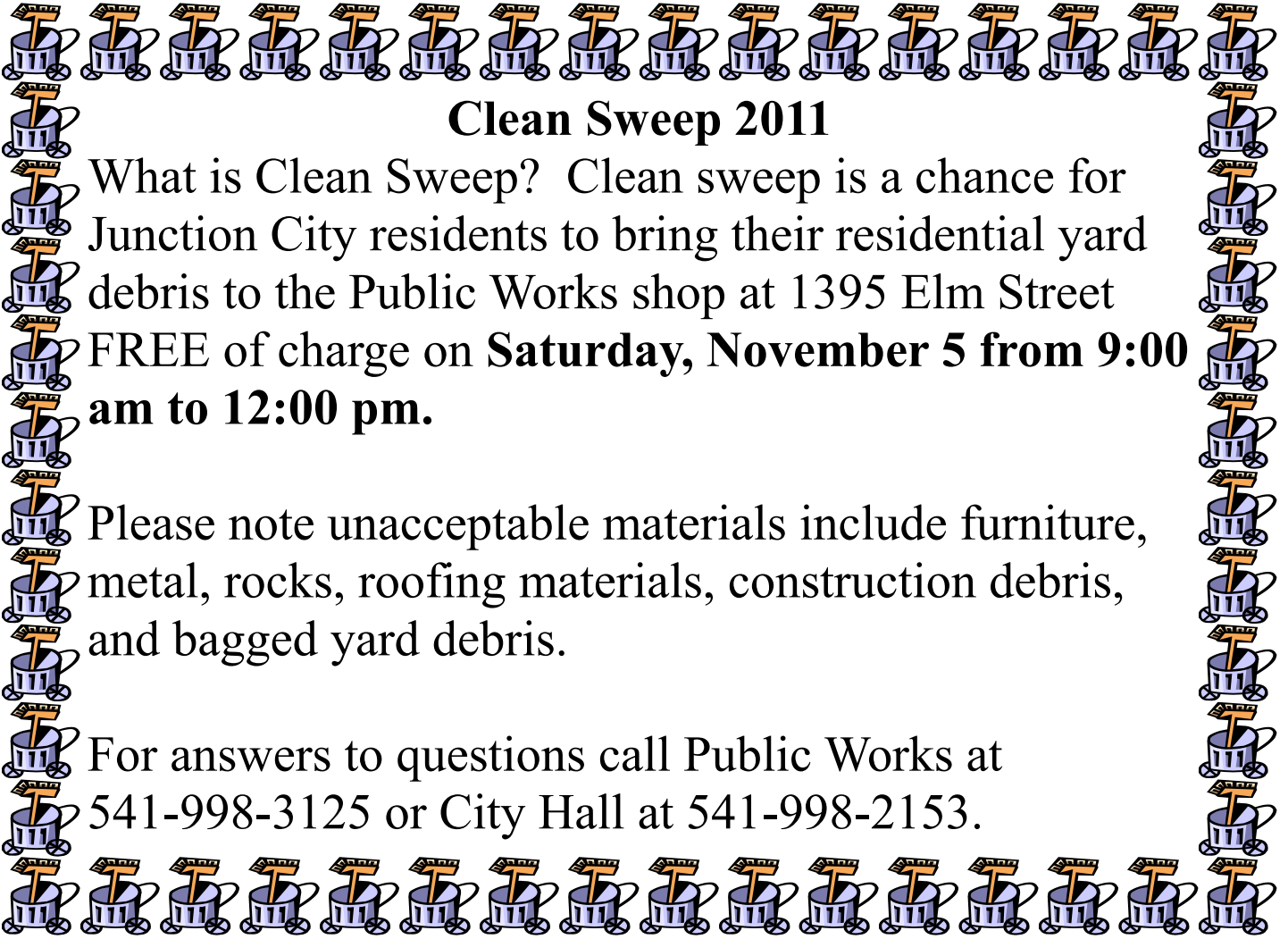




Clean Sweep 2011

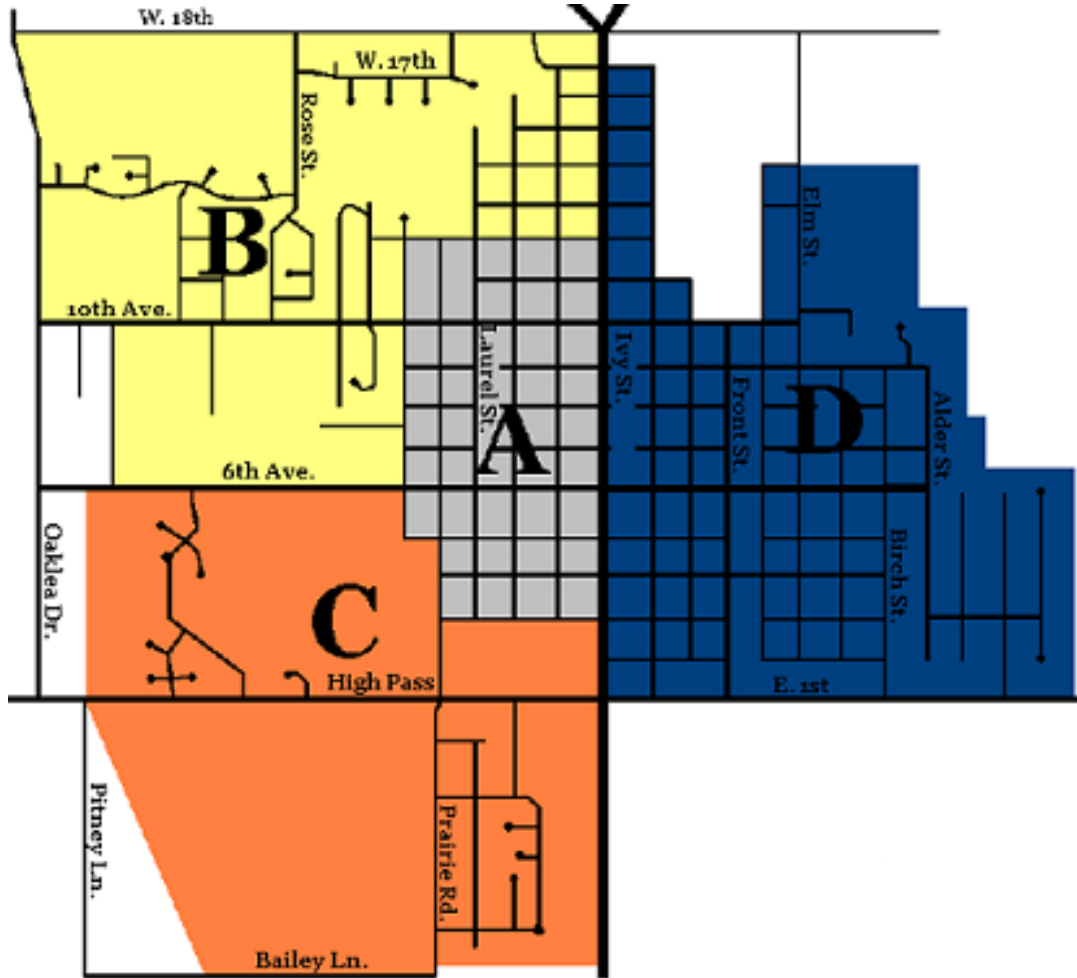


RATE PAYER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- B:** (Oaklea Middle School Area)
Nov. 15th – 19th
- C:** (Bailey Pk, SW Laurel Area)
Nov. 29th – Dec. 3rd
- D:** (East of Ivy Street)
Dec. 6th – 10th

Leaf Collection 2011

- ◆ Consider using leaves as mulch for gardens and flower beds
- ◆ Place leftover leaves in the street for the City to collect. Be sure leaves don't clog storm drains or gutters. Place leaves ONE FOOT away from the curb.
- ◆ If you see crews working in your neighborhood early, don't worry! They will return during your scheduled week.
- ◆ Please **DO NOT** bag leaves.

Leaf pickup in November is the ONLY time that any material or item may be placed in any right-of-way.
Leaves are the only items that will be picked up during that time if placed 12-inches from the curb.

RECYCLE SCHEDULE

NOTES:

- Recycling will be picked up every other week on the customer's garbage day.

- Yard debris will be picked up every other non-recycle week on the customer's garbage day.

- Place curbside by 7:00 AM.

- Recycle and yard debris containers that contain garbage will not be picked up by the recycler. They will be emptied by the garbage crew and the customer will be billed for a 3 can service dump.

- No glass in the blue recycle cart. Glass only in the yellow bin.

- Place blue recycle and gray yard debris cart 5 feet from green garbage cart and mailboxes.

- Place yellow glass bin 3 feet from the blue recycle cart.

- Place carts 10 feet away from parked cars, trees, utility poles & basketball hoops. Residents in cul-de-sacs please place carts 3 feet into the cul-de-sac away from cars.

- Carts must be no more than 3 feet from curb or street.

- The arrow on the lid of the carts needs to point towards the street.

- The lid must shut.

- Holidays shown in red. Pick up day will be the next working day.

ITEMS ACCEPTED:

**ALL ITEMS MUST BE FREE OF FOOD
AND OTHER CONTAMINANTS.
PLEASE RINSE PROPERLY.**

PAPER

(LOOSE IN CONTAINER – NO PLASTIC BAGS)
Mixed waste paper
Magazines & catalogs
Newspaper (including glossy ads)
Telephone books
Junk mail (envelopes with plastic windows are accepted)
Cardboard
Cereal & other dry food boxes (remove waxed liner)
Paper bags & sacks
Shredded paper (place in paper bag)
Gift wrap

METALS

Aluminum cans
Soda cans
Tin cans
Pots & pans

PLASTICS (larger than 6 oz. and no lids)

Plastic jugs (such as milk, detergent, and fabric softener)
Plastic jars (such as peanut butter containers)
Plastic bottles (such as water, soda, shampoo)*
Plastic Dairy tubs (such as butter, cottage cheese, etc.)

Glass Bottles & Jars: Place in the yellow tote only **green, clear, and brown.** No broken containers, no window glass, no bakeware, ceramics or Pyrex, and no light bulbs. Labels can stay but lids must be removed. Please clean containers. Food contaminates cause health problems. Place **INSIDE** the yellow tote.

Motor Oil: Place in a non-glass (no larger than 1 gallon) container with a screw on lid. A bleach or milk jug works best. This is necessary to avoid spillage. No other types of liquids can be accepted. Place **NEXT TO** the yellow tote.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

**NO ITEMS THAT ARE CONTAMINATED WITH FOOD
OR OTHER SUBSTANCES.
PLEASE RINSE PROPERLY.**

PAPER

Tissue paper, toilet paper, paper towels & napkins
Waxed or plastic coated paper & cardboard
Paper cups or plates
Ice cream cartons
Frozen juice containers
Pizza boxes & other food soiled papers and cardboard
Pet food bags

METALS

Scrap metals
Foil juice pouches

PLASTICS

Microwave cookware
Meat, bakery, vegetable trays & lids
Plastic bags (shopping, frozen food, bread & dry cleaning)
Takeout containers (usually clear or black plastic)
Cups or plates or utensils
Prescription pill containers
Lids or caps from plastic bottles & tubs

STYROFOAM PRODUCTS

Styrofoam cups & fast food containers
Packing peanuts & blocks

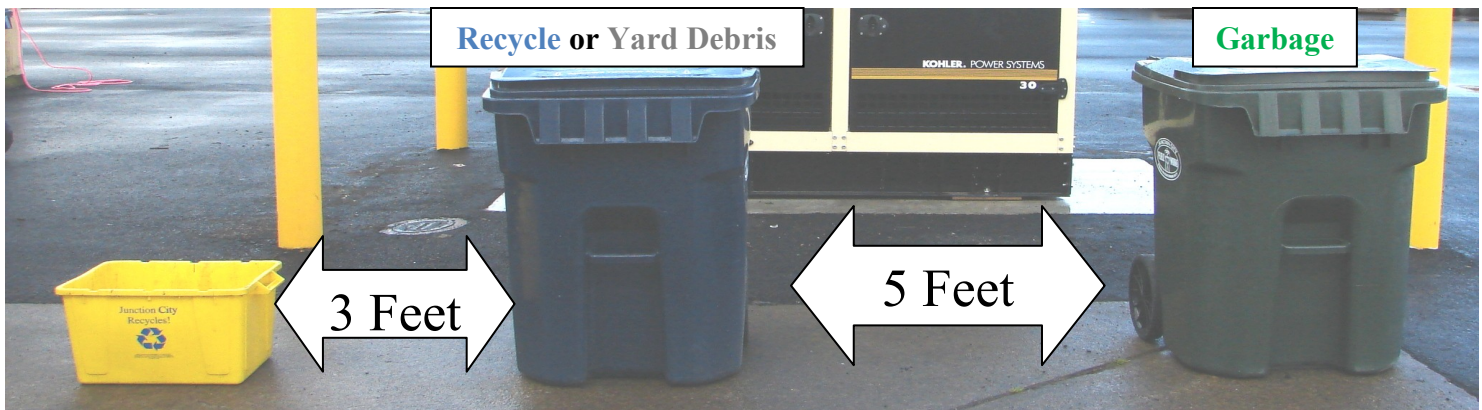
HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

Ceramic plates & cups,
Dishes & china
Plate, window & mirror glass
Light bulbs
Wire & clothes hangers
Batteries
Tires
Food Waste
Garbage

CONTAINERS THAT HELD TOXIC MATERIALS (Any container with a WARNING or CAUTION label)

Automotive product containers (gas, oil, antifreeze, etc)
Garden products (such as fertilizers or pesticides)
Aerosol cans
Cleaning product containers
Paint or stain containers

The “DO’s”



Place your carts out for collection according to the following guidelines:

- ⇒ Place all garbage, recycling, and yard debris carts at curb by **7:00 AM**
- ⇒ Place cart **5 feet** away from other roll carts, recycle bins & mailboxes
- ⇒ Place cart **10 feet** away from parked cars, trees, utility poles & basketball hoops
- ⇒ Carts must be no more than **3 feet** from curb or street
- ⇒ The handle and wheels of the cart must face away from the street
- ⇒ Place recycle bin at least **3 feet** away from recycle cart

Holiday Schedule

Are you wondering why your yellow bin (glass recycling) is not picked up at the same time as your blue cart (co-mingled recycling)? In May 2011, the City purchased an automated recycle truck, which has saved time, money, and other resources. The only down side is that glass must still remain separated from other co-mingled recyclables and hence must be picked up in a separate truck. WASTE PREVENTION TIPS

1. Use rechargeable batteries.
2. Use refillable pens, water bottles, lighters, and razors, not disposables.
3. Purchase products with post-consumer recycled content.
4. Buy in bulk whenever possible.
5. Bring your own reusable bag to the store.
6. Request “no bag please, “ if buying only a few items.

2. Do I know anybody who can use this?

BEFORE YOU BUY A PRODUCT, ASK YOURSELF:

1. Do I really need this?
2. Can I find this at a thrift store or second-hand store?
3. Is this a durable and/or repairable item?
4. Does this contain recycled materials?
5. Is there an alternative that uses less packaging?
